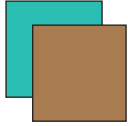


# Curiouser QAL Block 10 - Flying Geese Zigzags

All seam allowances are scant 0.25", and the finished square will measure 12.5"

## Materials



2 squares (5.75" x 5.75") in two different print or plain fabrics



2 x border rectangles (2.5" x 10" deliberately larger than needed)



2 x border rectangles (2.5" x 13" deliberately larger than needed)



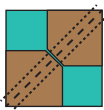
8 squares (3 1/8" x 3 1/8"), four each in the same two fabrics as before



## Instructions



With right sides together, place two smaller squares onto the larger square in the opposite colour, as shown in the picture. Trim off the corners where they overlap, and draw a diagonal line across the two smaller squares as shown in the diagram.



Sew a seam on each side of the drawn line - 0.25" each side.



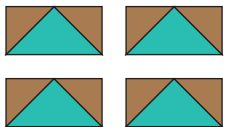
Fold the smaller squares into the centre, along the sewn lines, and pin them out of the way.



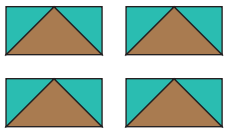
With right sides together, place a further two smaller squares onto the larger square in the opposite colour, as shown in the picture. Trim off the corners where they overlap, and draw a diagonal line across the two smaller squares as shown in the diagram.



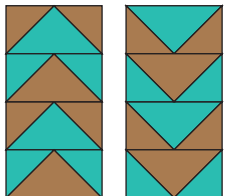
Sew a seam on each side of the new line - 0.25" each side.



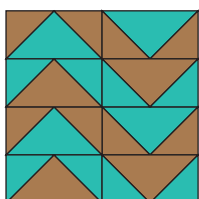
Now carefully cut down each of the drawn lines, and open out your 4 flying geese blocks. Press the seams and trim the edges as required.



Repeat from the first step with the remaining fabric to create another 4 flying geese blocks.



Sew two strips of 4 blocks each in the arrangement shown here.



Sew The two rectangles together and trim to 9.5" square if needed. Finally, add borders as described in the instructions for Block 2, and trim to 12.5" square.
